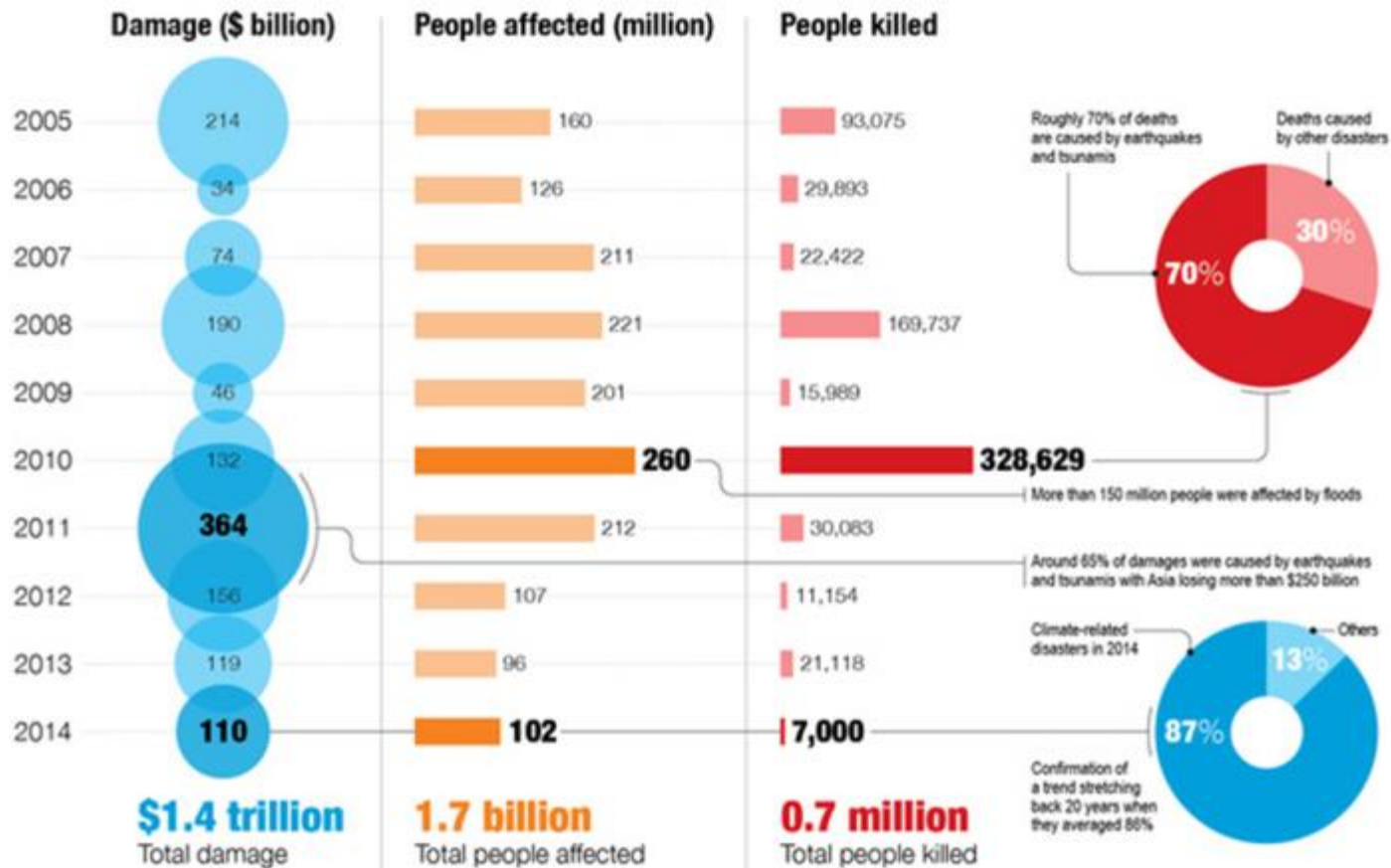


For 25 years, the UN has been actively supporting countries reduce the impact of disasters

- ✓ Adopted the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015-2030 and agreed on the Sendai Declaration.
- ✓ Shift from managing disasters to managing risk
- ✓ Focus on people-centered preventive approach to DRR.
- ✓ Mutually support of the SDGs

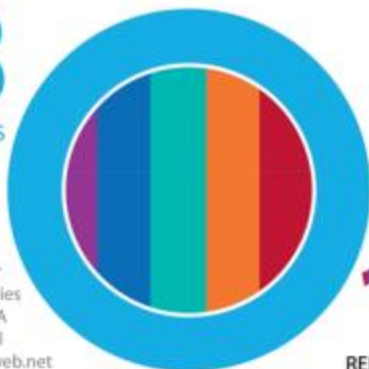
Disaster risk reduction is a core principle for the UN system's collective efforts to ensure that development is risk-informed at country and community levels.

May 2010. Small towns to major world capitals have signed up to commit to 'Ten Essentials' of an urbanized version of the HFA.

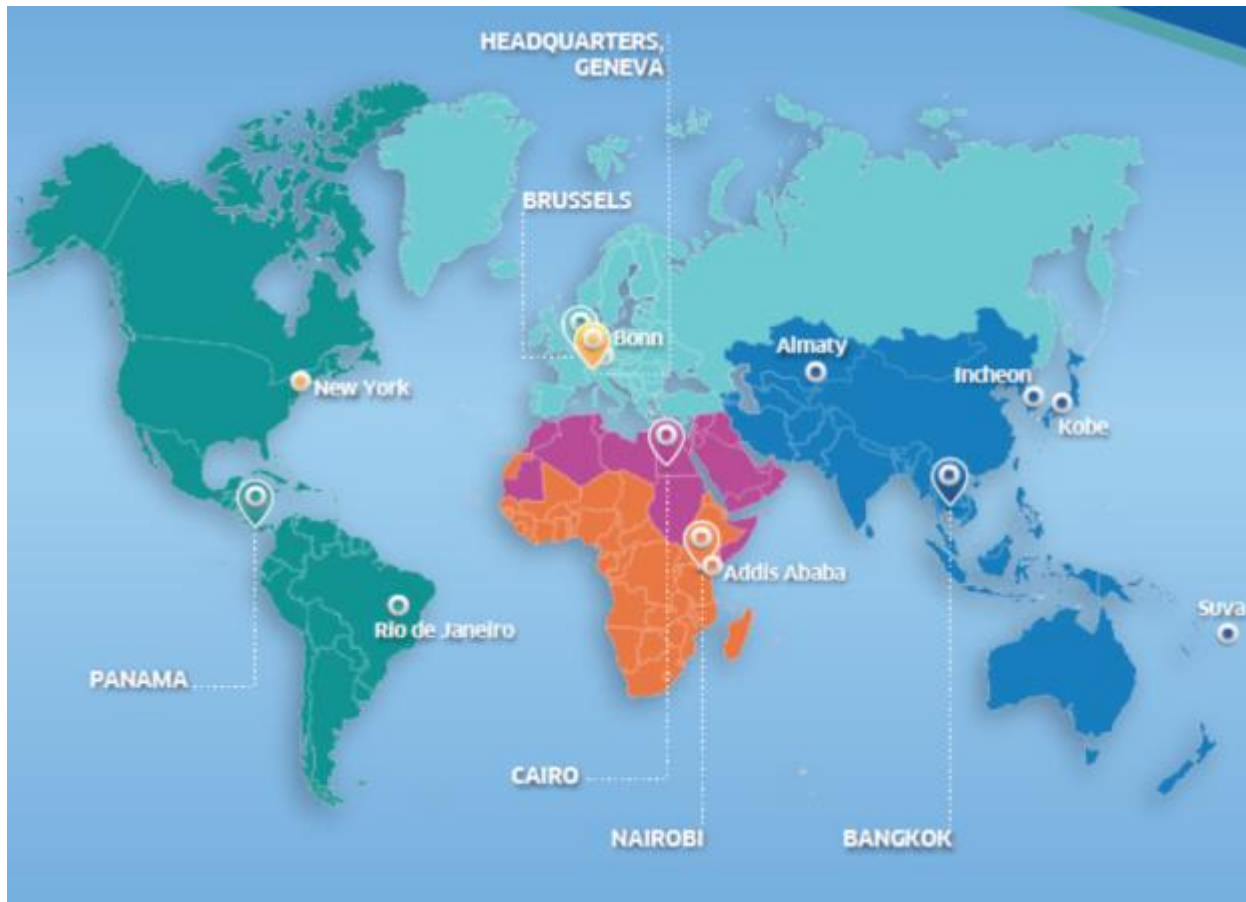
